Dear Parents and Guardians of 11th Grade Students,

Forest City Regional High School will administer the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) on Wednesday, November 19th, from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

The ASVAB is a valuable career exploration tool that helps students identify their strengths and connect them to a wide range of potential civilian and military occupations. It includes:

- A multiple-aptitude test that measures abilities in various academic and technical areas.
- A self-assessment to help students explore careers that align with their skills and preferences.
- Career exploration tools that connect individual strengths and interests to real-world opportunities.

Important Information:

- **Who can take it:** At Forest City Regional, it is offered to all 11th & 12th grade students.
- **Parent/Guardian Notification:** Because this test is school-administered, parent and guardian awareness is provided regarding student participation.
- **No military obligation:** Taking the ASVAB does not commit a student to military service in any way.
- **Scoring:** Test results are sent to the school, and each student receives a personal score report. Counselors use these results to guide students in exploring career and educational options.
- **Post-test interpretation:** A follow-up session will be provided to help students understand their scores and how they can be used to plan for the future.
- **Graduation Pathway:** In addition to supporting career exploration, the ASVAB can also serve as a data point toward meeting the Pennsylvania Department of Education's "Pathway to Graduation" requirements.

Members of the military will be at Forest City Regional High School on Wednesday, November 19th to administer this test.
